- 4. Consent Agenda Chairman Gordon made a motion to amend the agenda to change item 11. Adjournment down one to item 12. and move item 12. Executive Session per Idaho Code 74-206 (1) (b) up one to be item 11. Vice Chairman Adamson seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion carried.

5. Supervisors' Reports

- a. Maintenance Maintenance Supervisor Bob Kassebaum discussed several issues that need to be taken care of throughout the district and that the French drain at the elementary is working well with the spring runoff. The final inspections for the Community Wellness Center will be completed soon.

7. Old/New Business

- a. Idaho Center for Outdoor Education Superintendent Hunicke shared that progress is being made on the National Science Foundation grant and several events are being planned for the property this summer. The board will review the returned evaluations and discuss it with Superintendent Hunicke at a later date.

The Capstone topic was the impact of informal STEM on math and science student performance in 5th, 7th, and 8th grade. He is working with Central District Health on a grant that may be available to pay for extra after school activity bus days.
