- 1. Call to Order At 5:10 p.m. Chairman Ken Gordon called the regular school board meeting to order. Superintendent Brian Hunicke and District Clerk Cindy Hunter were present.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance
- **3. Establish Quorum** Present: Chairman Ken Gordon, Vice Chairman Brent Adamson, Trustee Mary Ellen McMurtrie, Trustee Brandee Kline, and Trustee Theresa Pledge.
- **4. Consent Agenda** The agenda was approved as amended with the addition of a new bus stop for item 5. Supervisor's Report item b. Transportation action item d. Approve Bus Routes for Robie

Creek, Clear Creek, Centerville, and Rim Ranches to add the new bus stop called Mile Marker 23.

a. Minutes - The minutes stand approved as presented.

b. Financial reports

1. Clerk's report - Clerk Hunter handed out the Financial Statements for the 2018-2019 fiscal year audit to the board. Clerk Hunter reported that the audit went very well with the funds performing as they should. The board thanked Clerk Hunter for her work on preparing for the audit with the necessary documents required. Clerk Hunter reported that the grant for fund 262 was awarded for \$ 26,118.00 which unfortunately is \$9,500 less than last year.

She has distributed many of them for the start of the school year. Bundy reported that the clinic is doing well with new staff and is seeing an increase in patients.

Woodruff commented that she is excited about the work that was done this summer on the new Special Education kitchen which will be used in the life skills class for her students. It will be a great addition to her programs.
- b. Building Principals Elementary Principal Jamie Pilkerton discussed that enrollment is up in the elementary and that the kindergarten and first grade classes have high enrollment numbers. She is in the process of brainstorming ideas to best accommodate the classes because of the increase of students. The Elementary teachers have been working hard and have begun training on the new math curriculum. Middle and High School Principal Sean Porter commented that the middle/highschool is down twelve students at the beginning of the school year. Teachers are working together to plan for the new Academic period Rise (Responsibility/Improvement/Support/Engagement). The first day of school students were involved in an assembly where the new no cell phone policy was discussed and explained.
